Angela also worked for the Library of Congress' National Library Service for the Blind and Physically Handicapped (NLS/BPH). She earned her Master's in Government from The Johns Hopkins University, a Bachelor of Science in Industrial Relations, and a Bachelor of Science in Psychology from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill.
